Eggplant Fritters.

Slice and peel the eggplant, cover with boiling water and allow to stand for an hour. Drain, put into boiling water and cook for 15 minutes. Drain again, mash, season with salt and pepper and mix with two well beaten eggs and enough flour to make a thick batter, but not too thick. Drop by spoonfuls into hot fat or vegetable oil, and fry until brown. Drain on brown paper and serve.

SIX DELICIOUS LUNCHEON FRITTERS.

Fritters, to be most enjoyable, should be served hot and crisp. Nearly every one likes fritters, and if properly made, so that grease is not absorbed during cooking, fritters are a delicious and substantial dish. In fact, meat, fish or egg fritters, with some beverage, here are a group of various fritters easy to prepare and inexpensive.

Corn Fritters.

1 can corn, 1-2 cupful of dried and sifted crumbs.

1 egg, well beaten, 1-2 cupful of milk, 1 teaspoonful of salt, 1 teaspoonful of baking powder, 1 tablespoonful of flour.

Chop the corn and add the other ingredients as named above. After mixing, drop from a tablespoon into deep fat and fry until nicely browned, or saute in a hot, greased frying pan.

Salmon Fritters.

1-1/2 cupfuls of flour, 1-4 teaspoonful of salt.

1-2 teaspoonfuls of baking powder, 1 egg, well beaten, 1-2 cupful of water.

1-4 teaspoonful of paprika, 1-4 teaspoonful of onion juice.

1-2 can of salmon, chopped fine. Sift the flour, salt and baking powder. Add egg, water and seasonings and beat well. Add salmon and drop from a tablespoon into hot, deep fat. Cook until brown, drain or soft paper, and serve with tartar sauce if desired.

ESTABLISH PARCEL POST TO BRITISH EAST AFRICA

Parcel post has been established between the United States and British East Africa and Uganda, which must be shipped via London, according to word received at the local postoffice. The weight limit of parcels is 11 pounds. But in addition there is a transmission charge of 35 cents for the first three pounds; 72 cents for the next four, and \$1.08 for the remaining four pounds.

Special attention is required for shipments of trees, plants, stocks and seeds. Waterproof covers should be used for the parcels intended for places beyond the services of the Uganda railway. Parcels cannot be registered.


