

ALTON PACKARD IN LECTURE

Final Program of Chautauqua
Consists of Humorous
Talk and Song.

Characterized as "funnier than a Ford" and quite living up to the characterization, Alton Packard entertained his chautauqua audience for two hours and a half Tuesday night with funny pictures, funny stories and funny songs. His lecture was entitled "Vanity Fair" and between his humorous caricatures of the people inhabiting Vanity Fair, the earth, he took occasion to drive home a few much needed lessons.

Quickly, and at the same time keeping up his rapid fire of witty sayings, he sketched for his audience pictures of a barefoot boy bathing in a mountain stream, of a howling youngster, newlyweds on their honeymoon, a fashion plate lady, "Fair Vanity" and last of all, a picture which could not fail to leave a lasting impression with his audience. Vivid in its coloring, he pictured an old farm house, with father and mother walking hand in hand down the pathway toward the beautiful sunset and dreaming in their loneliness of the children who once played in the orchard toward which they wended their way. He accompanied this picture with a strong plea for the preservation of the ideals of the American home and for the wiping out of socialism, extreme radicalism and bolshevism, which tend to dominate our ideals and our ideals.

Mr. Packard proved himself a poet, a pianist and a vocalist, as well as a humorist and cartoonist, when he played and sang for his audience a poem written by himself paying tribute to American girlhood. He also sang a very few of the 27 verses of that most remarkable song, "When You Get What You Want You Don't Want It."

Metropolitan Quartet Pleases.

The evening prelude and the entire afternoon program were rendered by the Metropolitan quartet, including Miss Hazel Silver, soprano; Walter Peterson, tenor; Miss Esther Muenstermann, contralto, and Curtis W. Johns, bass. Miss Laura Clendenen, pianist, proved herself a most sympathetic accompanist. Miss Clendenen and Miss Muenstermann are not new to South Bend audiences. They appeared at a recital given during the winter by Mrs. W. E. Bryan and were also presented in quartet work under the auspices of the Progress club.

The ability of the individual members of the quartet is a recognized fact and they delighted both of their South Bend audiences.

The afternoon program of the quartet was divided into two parts, the first including a miscellaneous group of songs and the second a song cycle, "The Morning of the Year," by Charles Wakefield Cadman. The ensemble and solo work in the latter was especially fine and the acappella work was notable.

Among the numbers rendered by the quartet were: "Carmena," "Lock Lomond," "Going to Press," "Kerry Dance," "Red Rose," "Voices of the Woods," by Rubenstein, and the quartet from "Rigoletto." The soprano solos included "Birthday Song," by Cowan and "The Americans Come," by Foster; the bass solos, "Just You," by Burleigh, and "The Armorer Song" from "Robin Hood," the tenor solos, "The Star," by Rogers, and "Jean," by Sprouse, and the contralto solos, "What's in the Air Today," by Eden, and "Dawn," by Curran.
