

CLEVELAND HOLDS SHIPS OF WORLD

Anchors Manufactured There Are on Vessels of the Seven Seas.

CLEVELAND, O., Aug. 22.—Wherever ships rest at anchor on the seven seas or their tributaries some of them held by Cleveland made anchors and anchor chains, according to Cleveland vessel men. For in Cleveland, an inland port, more anchors are fashioned and chains welded than in any other city in this country, and perhaps in the world.

Eight carloads of steel anchors, the largest single consignment on record, recently was shipped from Cleveland to the Emergency Fleet corporation at Hog Island. They will be placed on the fleets of modern trading ships which America is sending after the trade of the world.

They are modern "national stockless" anchors of the latest approved design. The old-fashioned "T" Bar at the top has been eliminated but the rabbit-eared flukes are turned and built to hold to the ocean floor wherever cast.

Before the war, Cleveland anchors were famous in Great Lakes. But it was only when ships went down to sea the anchors made inland became world famous. Now they are carried not only under the American flag but under the banners of almost every nation.

WANTS DIVORCE BECAUSE SHE WAS KEPT IN SHACK

LOS ANGELES, Calif., Aug. 22.—Mrs. Mary Buckell told Superior Judge Frank H. Willis that her husband, Dr. A. T. Buckell, insisted on her living in a little shack in the rear of their home.

NEWSPAPER REPORTERS FROM NEW ASSOCIATION

ST. LOUIS, Mo., Aug. 22.—An organization of newspaper reporters, editors and artists, with the object of improving the standing of the newspaper profession and to secure for active editorial employees increased salaries to meet the advance in the cost of living, has been formed here under the name of the "St. Louis Association of Journalists." Employees of the five English language newspapers published here and representatives of press associations are eligible to membership in the association.

The organization has taken a definite stand against affiliation with trades unions. In seeking wage adjustments the association voted to require employers of each newspaper to bargain collectively with their respective employees.

A majority of the editorial workers employed here have joined the association and plans are being made to affiliate with other similar organizations throughout the country with the view of forming a national association of newspaper men.
