

DECLARATION OF HOOVER SAID TO BE "PREMATURE"

Friends of Food Administra-
tor Force Alignment With
G. O. P. Party.

NEW YORK, March 31.—The presidential primary, though regarded by many politicians as ineffective, forced Herbert Hoover to make a "premature" declaration of his alignment with the republican party, it was learned today.

This announcement, which is made conditional on the understanding that "the republican party, with the independent element, with which I (Hoover) am naturally affiliated, adopts a forward looking, liberal, constructive platform on the treaty and our economic issues * * * and is neither reactionary nor radical," was made in a telegram from Hoover to the Hoover Republican club of California.

Plan of Friends.
Friends of Hoover had planned that the former food administrator's formal declaration of affiliation with the republican party should be made after, or during the proposed conference in Chicago next month.

It was believed this would be the psychological time for Hoover to declare himself a republican.

However, the California preferential and direct primaries are scheduled for May 4. The state law provides that a candidate must make a declaration of principles at least 30 days before the primaries. California is the home state of both Hoover and Sen. Hiram Johnson. The latter is making his fight there on a program including opposition to the League of Nations in any form. Hoover favored a league with certain reservations.

Claim Emergency.
According to Hoover's friends, they decided the emergency demanded an immediate declaration by him.

Copies of the telegram were sent to Hoover republican headquarters in Detroit last night. It was expected this would clarify the situation in that state, where Hoover is entered by both the republicans and democrats in the preferential primaries April 5.

"I'll say this much for Gov. Lowden," he continued, "he has promised to come to Washington next Monday and give me a list of his campaign subscribers." A bevy of Lowden lieutenants continued the Illinois governor's campaign today with flying trips to Indiana.
