

## PLAN CAMPAIGN TO AID SCOUTS BUDGET IN CITY

Council to Launch Drive for  
\$12,000 to Aid  
Work.

Plans for a campaign to raise \$12,000 for three year budget in boy scout work were laid at a meeting of the scout council of the city at the Chamber of Commerce Friday evening.

Solicitation of this fund will be started in the near future by members of the council and others interested in boy scout work in the city. This amount will take care of the activities of scoutcraft in the city for the next three years.

**Executive Seeks Support**  
Joseph Taylor, scout executive, told the meeting of work already accomplished and laid emphasis on proceeding slowly, stating it were better to be sure you had the support of the older men than to have a large group of active boys with no leadership.

Fred L. Dennis, president of the council, outlined the plans for South Bend in the next few months which, when accomplished, will place South Bend among the leading cities of the United States in the boy scout movement.

**Explains Movement**  
In response to many requests from parents and others interested in the work for more information regarding the principles of the movement, Joseph Taylor, in charge of the local scout work, has given the following facts: "The scout law which is accepted by each boy as he enters the troop, aims to bring out the best points in every young boy and to inspire him to high ideals. The scout law which follows is the first requirement of tenderfoot applicant."

1. A Scout is Trustworthy.  
A Scout's honor is to be trusted. If he were to violate his honor by telling a lie, or cheating, or by not doing exactly a given task, when trusted on his honor, he may be directed to hand over his scout badge.

A Scout is loyal.  
He is loyal to all to whom loyalty is due; his Scout leader, his home and parents and country.

A Scout is Helpful.  
He must be prepared at any time to save life, help injured persons, and share the home duties. He must do at least one good turn to somebody every day.

A Scout is Friendly.  
He is a friend to all and a brother to every other Scout.

A Scout is Courteous.  
He is polite to all, especially to women, children, old people, and the weak and helpless. He must not take pay for being helpful or courteous.

A Scout is Kind.  
He is a friend to animals. He will not kill nor hurt any living creature needlessly, but will strive to save and protect all harmless life.

A Scout is Obedient.  
He obeys his parents, scout master, patrol leader, and all other duly constituted authorities.

A Scout is Cheerful.  
He smiles whenever he can. His obedience to orders is prompt and cheerful. He never shirks nor grumbles at hardships.

A Scout is Thrifty.  
He does not wantonly destroy property. He works faithfully, wastes nothing and makes the best use of his opportunity. He saves his money so that he may pay his own way, be generous to those in need, and helpful to worthy objects. He may work for pay, but must not receive tips for courtesies or good turns.

A Scout is Brave.  
He has the courage to face danger in spite of fear and has to stand up for the right against the cowardly friends or the jeers or threats of enemies and defeat does not down him.

A Scout is Clean.  
He keeps clean in body, and thought, stands for clean speech, clean sport, clean habits, and travels with a clean crowd.

A Scout is Reverent.  
He is reverent toward God. He is faithful in his religious duties and respects the conviction of others in matters of custom and religion.

## BIG FOUR RAILWAY TO IMPROVE ROAD

MUNCIE, Ind., April 9.—During the next two years the Big Four railroad company will spend \$2,000,000 in making improvements in Muncie, according to promises made Mayor Kelly and members of the Commercial club here Friday by officials of the railroad company. The improvements contemplated are the construction of four subways at the four principal crossings in the city and the building of belt line around the city to take care of all freight traffic. With the construction of this line, only passenger trains will pass through the city proper. Attending the conference here were: H. A. Worcester, vice president; E. M. Costin, general manager; C. A. Paquette, chief engineer; I. S. Downing, general master car builder of the Big Four and their secretaries. The work on the subways will be started within a few weeks.
