

STELLAR BOXING CARD BILLED FOR NEXT FIGHT SHOW

Bill Henry and Murphy Are Primed for Battle at Oliver Theater.

The semi-wind-up of the stellar boxing card to be staged in the Oliver theater on April 22 will bring together Jimmie Kelly of Chicago and Johnnie Hagen, a youth battler of Detroit. Kelly made a strong impression on fight fans in his last appearance in a local ring when he chased Young Duffy of Logansport, Ind., around the ring for four rounds before the referee stopped the bout to save Duffy from a certain knockout.

The youngster displayed a wicked punch for a midget and his foot-work and ring generalship won commendation from the ring critics. His popularity in this vicinity is established by his showing in that bout and is noted as the opening for a match with Frankie Mason, the South Bend handful champ. Hagen is a comer with a favorable reputation and it is hoped that the winner of this bout can be matched to meet the present title holder in the near future.

The most attractive bout of the card however, will be the Murphy-Henry tilt, which is scheduled for the big event of the program. These two lightweights have met twice before with Henry winning the first by a shade by the majority of newspaper writers. The Irishman still has friends however, who can out point the Great Lakes sailor and reports from his training headquarters indicate that he is working out daily and will be in prime condition on the night of theastic battle.

Another attractive spot on the card will be the Eddie Welsh-Smith tilt, listed as a preliminary. Welsh is a South Bend milt artist who is rapidly gathering a strong following through his ability to put his opponents away early in the fight.

Welsh is billed to meet Sailor White, who claims the navy championship at Laporte on April 16. Welsh is working out daily for his two coming scrapes.
