

LIQUOR SMUGGLING ALONG BORDER IS BECOMING SERIOUS

Mexican Authorities Asked to
Cooperate With United
States to Stop Practice.

MEXICO CITY, April 10.—Mexico's embarrassing position—that of having a dry neighbor to the north of her—has no end of worries.

Reports of smuggling difficulties continue, booze threatening to supplant the place of arms and munitions as a source of contraband trouble. The latest American complaint, however, instead of coming from the border, is voiced by the officials of Galveston, New Orleans and other gulf ports. Sailors on tankers and other steamers from Mexico, they declare, are acting as "booze agents" and are carrying liquor across the gang plank when they are granted shore leave.

Mexican authorities have been asked to cooperate with the Americans in suppressing this practice, so that henceforth, according to an announcement made here, every effort will be made to strip Mexican sailors of bottled goods before they leave home ports for the United States.

Fear Is Expressed.
Fear is expressed here, following the receipt of communications from Mexican consuls in the United States, that the producers of wood alcohol and other forms of pseudo whisky in the states, hard pressed by American federal authorities, will attempt to dispose of their fake stocks in Mexico and other Latin-American countries. The Mexicans don't want these bogus goods—they have plenty of the genuine article—so the border and port authorities have been instructed to maintain a sharp lookout for anything that smacks of imitation booze.

Gen. Ignacio Enriquez, head of the Social Defense League of Chihuahua and candidate for the governorship of that border state, offers a remedy for the international booze problem.

Make Border Dry.
"Make the border dry," says Enriquez, "the Mexican as well as the American side." Whereupon violent protests are heard, both from Mexican and American sources.

HORN FIBRE IN SHOES STOPS SALE

STOCKHOLM, April 10.—Sale of 70,000 pairs of American shoes was stopped here the other day because they had been found to contain horn fibre in the heel and toe. Use of substitutes for leather in shoes is forbidden by the Swedish law.

Public indignation has been expressed over the stopping of the sale, owing to the alleged exorbitant prices demanded by domestic manufacturers.

The selling firm has appealed to the government to permit the shoes to be sold.

DRIVE SQUEALING PIGS DOWN THE STREETS OF DETROIT

DETROIT, April 10.—City ordinances and custom both went by the boards here because of the switchmen's strike. Squealing pigs—1,500 of them—had to be removed from cars in railroad yards and driven for some distance through the streets to the parking houses. They scattered in all directions, demoralized traffic and furnished amusement for almost everybody except the street car motormen. Some of the porkers were caught under street cars but were extricated without serious damage.

JEWELRY STYLES SHOWN IN CITIES

Displays Indicate That Green
Will be Leading Color
of Season.

CHICAGO, April 10.—Spring styles in jewelry on display in the showrooms are different from those of last year. Green as represented in jade is the leading color. Last year red was the predominating note.

Bead necklaces have a touch of the oriental in them. Round beads and odd shapes are being shown. Some of the necklaces are all beads and some of beads and links. The beads are larger than formerly and sometimes are set with tiny stones such as pearls, emeralds, garnets and sapphires.

Earrings that are being shown are mostly of long Egyptian type, some of which seem like weights because of a large artificial pearl or fancy jade ball hangs from a sterling chain.

Flexible bracelets are made of sterling silver and set with crystals. In some of the bracelets, the crystals are combined with other stones, such as onyx, emeralds and sapphires.

Large onyx centers with surrounding clusters of crystals are among the novelties.

AMATEURS CALLED MODERN WRIGHTS

Illinois Aviation Club Helps
Construction of Air-
planes by Boys.

CHICAGO, April 10.—When the Wright brothers announced that their first crude airplane had flown for almost one minute, carrying a passenger, the news was a sensation. Juvenile aviation circles of Chicago were equally thrilled recently when William T. Schweizer, age 14, of the Illinois Model Airplane club, flew his nonpiloted monoplane 4,634 feet, for a new model record.

The Illinois Model Airplane club, sponsored by the Illinois Aviation club, an organization of former army flyers, has 40 boy airplane builders in its membership, and the use of a regular flying field. Any fair day the boys may be found at Ashburn, flying field, in South Chicago, trying out their

home made flyers. The first requirement of membership is that a boy must build a model airplane, constructed to scale, and capable of flying. The propelling power is rubber bands or springs.

Kite flying has become practically extinct in Chicago since boys have begun experimenting with the airplane models.
