PRESBYTERIANS HOLD SERVICES

To Mr. and Mrs. M. M. Fisher. Musical Program and Sermon.

The services at the First Presbyterian church yesterday morning were of special interest, being a memorial to Mr. and Mrs. M. M. Fisher, whose bequest made possible the enlargement of the organ by the addition of two stops, the saxophone and vox humana.

The music was specially arranged for this service. Miss Nina A. Gabriel, organist, rendered as the prelude, "The Morning Star," by Gordon B. Nevins, for saxophone and vox humana; offertory, "Hymn to Saint Cecilia," Gounod-Westbrook, solo for vox humana; postlude, Handel's "The Messiah," for the chorus choir sang "O Blessed Savior Mine," by Wooler, and Arthur Shank gave, by request, "My Ain Country."

The pastor preached on "The Immortality of Influence," the text being Proverbs 10:7: "The memory of the righteous is blessed." At the beginning reference was made to the character and life of Mr. and Mrs. Fisher, their loyal devotion to the church, keeping in mind to the very last the work of the kingdom, and remembering the church in a substantial way.

Their gift made possible the enlargement of the organ, adapting it more fully to the worship, giving greater tone possibilities and at the same time serving as a perpetual memorial to their interest in the church's progress.

The Greatness of Life.

Speaking in general, the pastor said in part, the immortality of influence is based upon the personal relation to Christ. The greatness of life is what it transmits of itself to others. We can make an abiding impression on our generation and on the world only as we keep in touch with the source of life and give to others the fullness of character. We live only as we live in Christ.

Carlyle said, "The history of the world is the biography of its great men." In the Christian life men are influenced more by living models than by abstract truth.

The good man never dies; his name may be forgotten, but his work lives on. Luther is dead, yet the Reformation still influences the thought of civilization. We can never lose our life if we put it into the lives of others and into the kingdom of God.

The examples of the great call is to a truer devotion to our tasks that we may give to the coming generations the largest fruitage of our lives.

SAM GILBERT BUYS PART KELLER BLOCK

Pays \$1,000 Per Foot for East Portion. To Hold It as Investment.

Sam Gilbert, of the drygoods firm of M. Gilbert & Son, Mishawaka and South Bend, has purchased the east end of the Keller business block on Lincoln way W. from Fred W. Keller, South Bend, who erected it about nine years ago. It is said to be one of the best paying investments in Mishawaka. The deal was closed Saturday night, the price paid being about \$1,000 a front foot.

The stores in the block are tenanted by Winery's drygoods, Vogt's jewelry, Lincoln theater and the A. C. Haslinger Co. The upper story is occupied as offices and living rooms, while the Knights of Pythias lease the large hall and recreation rooms.

Mr. Gilbert stated to the News-Times that he bought the property as an investment, having great faith in the future prosperity of Mishawaka. He expects the present tenants will in all likelihood remain.

Five years ago the firm opened the store at the corner of Mill st. and Lincoln highway, Oscar Gilbert being in charge of the business, which has since grown to large dimensions. His brother, Sam, came to Mishawaka shortly before war.

FORT WAYNE, Ind., April 11.—A house containing 20 persons at prayer is said to have been spared destruction in the recent tornado, despite the fact that it was directly in the path of the storm.

Twenty persons who were guests of Charles Smith, a farmer, living near Monroeville, vouch for the statement that the funnel-shaped cloud lifted suddenly as it approached the Smith home, where they were praying, leaving them unharmed. A few hundred yards beyond the Smith property, however, the tornado is said to have again descended and continued its work of destruction.

It was at Mr. Smith's suggestion that prayer was offered as the storm approached. Those at the Smith home are said to have greater faith in prayer now than they ever had before.
