

INDUSTRIAL COURT ISSUE IN NEBRASKA

Votes Will Decide Question of
New Institution at Special Election.

LINCOLN, Neb., April 12.—Creation by a future state legislature of an industrial court to determine controversies between employers and employees in any business or vocation affected with a public interest will be possible in Nebraska if a constitutional provision is adopted by the voters at a special election next Sept. 21.

The proposal is one of about 40 other constitutional changes proposed by the state's constitutional convention which has just practically finished up its work of revising the existing constitution to meet the modern needs of the state. The industrial commission, under the proposal's terms, would also have power to enforce laws against "unfair business practices and unconscionable gains affecting the public welfare." Appeals to the supreme court from the commission's final orders would be provided.

Other Changes Proposed.
Other constitutional changes proposed by the convention for submission along with the industrial commission plan would accomplish the following:

Make it possible for Nebraskans in the regular army to vote regardless of where they are stationed.

Provide for election of supreme court judges by districts instead of by the state at large.

Empower the legislature to regulate the minimum wage and hours of employment for women and children.

Require that common school branches in public, private, parochial and denominational schools be taught in the English language.

The language proposal is in line with a law enacted by the last regular legislature designed to prevent foreign language instruction from interfering with school children's regular course of study.

SOLDIERS DESERT FROM RUSS ARMY AT ALL CHANCES

THE HAGUE, April 12.—Russian peasants desert from the red army at every opportunity and go back to their villages where they earn more money than they ever before dreamed of earning, asserts the correspondent of the Amsterdam Handelsblad who recently visited Soviet Russia. "Nobody thinks of shooting them for desertion."

"For the little they cultivate on their own soil people bring them whatever they want—gold, gramophones, clothes or money," he adds. "Nevertheless the power of the Soviet in the country is very slight. The peasants accepted from communism all that suited them. Having secured the advantages, he listened to the 'poes' or village priests who resist this ungodly and particularly un-Christian government."

SWISS PREPARE FOR AMERICAN TOURISTS

GENEVA, April 12.—Switzerland is making ready to grab off all the dollars left in the pockets of American tourists after they visit the battlefields of France and Belgium this year.

Every hotel around Lake Geneva and at every other Swiss resort is sprucing up and taking on airs. Swiss hotel and restaurant keepers are hastily restocking their wine cellars with gin and whiskey on the theory so prevalent in Europe that the way to catch an American is to hand him a cocktail or a high ball. But there'll be no cheap drink for the man from dry U. S. A. Right now one high ball costs the equivalent of 50 cents in American money and the price probably will go higher.

SHORTAGE OF NAIL SUPPLY REMOVED

PITTSBURGH, Pa., April 12.—By increasing the production of nails 15 per cent, steel mills in the Pittsburgh district have eliminated fear of a shortage.

Building firms in New York, Chicago, Detroit and a number of other cities have drawn heavily upon the supply of nails on hand, and builders have begun to fear for the immediate future of their work. Pittsburgh contractors took up the question with the mills, and full speed ahead was ordered, with the result that production soon overtook consumption, and authorities now say there is enough nails for all building projects in sight.

NEW IMMIGRANTS MAKING RECORD RUSH TO MINN.

Fergus Falls, Minn., April 12.—New immigration records have been made in this section during the last two weeks in March and there are indications that the movement of farmers to this section will continue throughout the spring.

Recently 17 carloads of immigrants' goods arrived on one train, most of the owners are moving their possessions to farms within a five mile radius of this place.

The demand has been for the best farm lands and transfers have been the largest in the history of Otter Tail county. During the first week in March, deeds to the amount of \$1,362,247, were filed in the register of deeds office here. The total real estate valuation of the county is \$13,578,491.

Good farm lands are selling from \$150 to \$200 per acre, which is a record price for this section.

BUENOS AIRES, April 12.—The Argentine has retained its affection for his national dance, the tango, despite the introduction of American "jazz" music and syncopated melodies in the programs of Argentine balls and dances. NORTH AND SOUTH SIDES ARE JOINED

New Bridge Over Chicago
River is Built at
Michigan Blvd.

CHICAGO, April 12.—The north side and south side Chicago will be deck bascule bridge across the Chicago river at Michigan blvd. opens to traffic next May. For twenty years the miles of lakeshore drive, north and Michigan blvd. south, have been separated by a crooked, narrow passage way, at the river, known as the bottle-neck. The opening of the bridge and the last link of the boulevard system will do away with that.

The bridge which is eight times as large as any other street bridge in Chicago cost \$5,000,000 and contains ten thousand tons of steel. A 450 horse-power motor has been installed to operate it. It was designed by Hugh Young who says that it is the largest bridge of its kind in the world.

The bascule or jack-knife type bridge opens by breaking in the center, both sections swing up to a position nearly vertical.

When Mayor Thompson made his official trip of inspection to the newly finished bridge he decided to climb to the top of one section while it was up and come down with it as the bridge closed. After ascending half way, however, he concluded that it was wiser than he had expected and came down again under his own power.

The bridge foreman has estimated that 100,000 men and women of Chicago have spent five hours each in watching construction work on the project since it was begun last October.

HOME ESTABLISHED FOR HELLO GIRLS

CHICAGO, April 12.—A home for telephone girls with numerous recreations will be established here as a means of solving the traffic and housing problems. A 40-room apartment building, to house about 80 girls, is being converted by the telephone company into a boarding house at an approximate cost of \$50,000. The dormitory will have a large service kitchen, dining room, laundry and a number of sewing rooms. Each apartment will be furnished with a phonograph or a piano. The building is expected to be open by June.
