

## CANADA GUIDES IN ORGANIZATION

Form Organization to Prevent  
Accidents From Random  
Shooting.

TORONTO, Ont., April 13.—That the number of "I thought it was a deer" shooting accidents may be cut to the minimum and fish and game of the great northern Ontario hunting and fishing district saved from wanton destruction, the Ontario Outfitters' and Guides' association is being formed here. Its members will be licensed and certain territory will be allotted to each. This will enable guides and their parties to know just who is in the woods in their neighborhood and it is expected a great many shooting fatalities will be eliminated.

The three main purposes of the Ontario Outfitters' and Guides' association will be:

1.—To insure the securing of competent and qualified guides for the many visiting sportsmen.

2.—To insure as far as possible a uniform rate in charges made by outfitters and guides for their services, and provide disciplinary measures for guides who may be guilty of exorbitant charges.

3.—To prevent guides from trespassing upon the rights of others who may be established in certain districts. This to eliminate the many dangers and inconveniences arising when other guides at the same time bring parties into the district already being hunted by the guide to whom the territory is allotted.

## INFLUENZA ABATING IN JAPAN, THOUSANDS DIE

TOKYO, April 13.—The influenza epidemic, which has been widespread in Japan since last September, is abating, but police authorities still urge the people to be inoculated with serum and have provided for free inoculation for the poor.

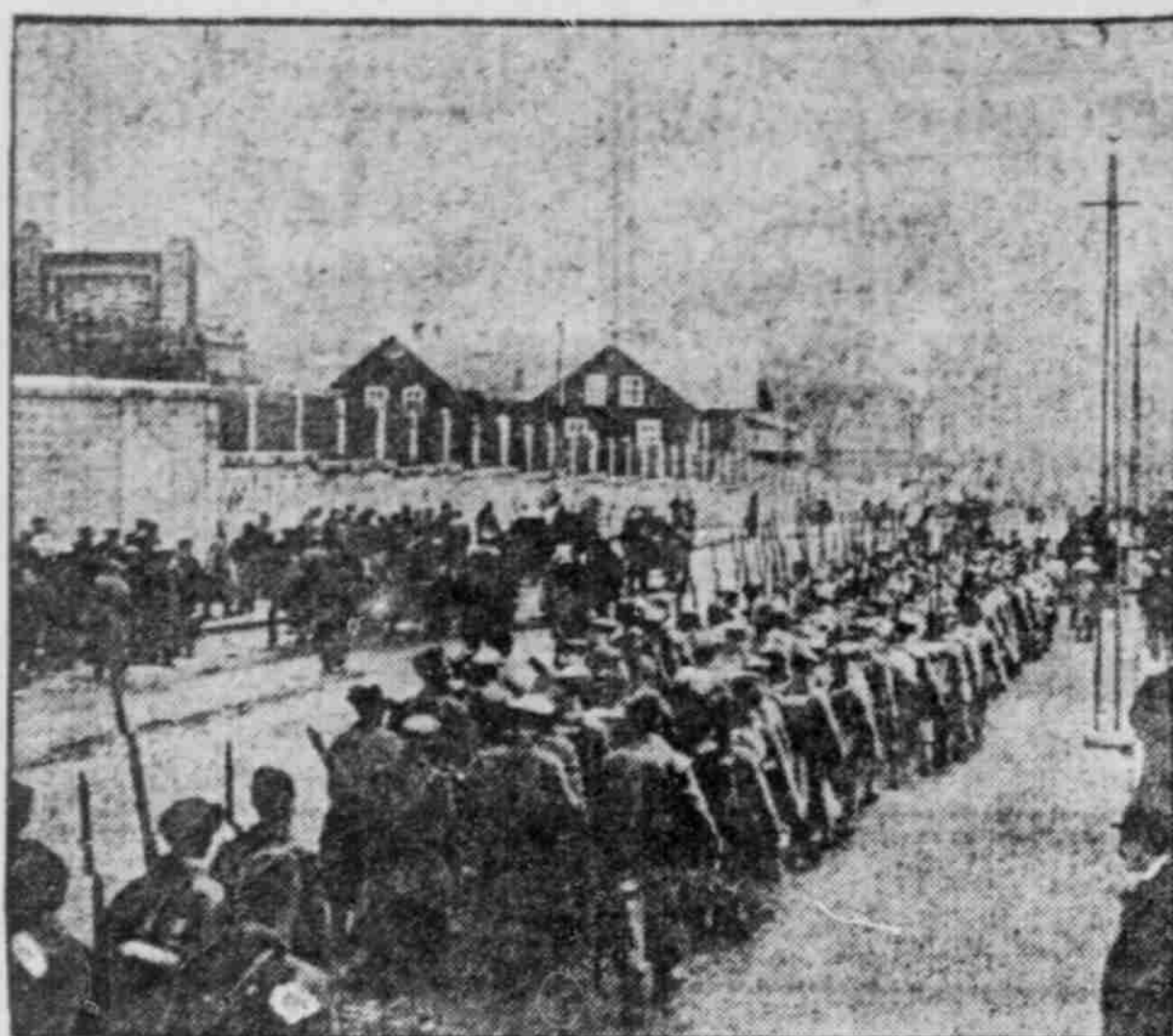
All told there have been 1,724,362 cases of influenza in the country since September and 65,352 persons have died of that disease.

## Troops Entering Vladivostok



Russian troops are seen entering Vladivostok, an important seaport of Russia, just before occupation by Japanese troops. After eight hours of severe fighting with the Reds the Japanese took entire control of the city. The Japanese flag is flying on all government buildings in place of the Russian standard, which has been lowered. Many Russians have fled to the mountains, and those that remained in the town have been disarmed, many of them being arrested and deported.

## METHODISTS WIND UP ANNUAL MEET

Reading of Appointments  
Concludes Seventy-Seventh  
Convention.

RICHMOND, Ind., April 13.—With the reading of appointments late Monday night the 77th annual session of the North Indiana Methodist conference came to an end here Monday night. The morning session was taken up largely with the reading of reports.

The conference collected \$194,556 for foreign missions, an increase of \$138,834 over the preceding year, according to the report of Treasurer David W. Jones. For home missions, public education and the Sunday school board the total contributed was \$333,951, an increase of \$155,345.

Membership Increase.  
A total increase in membership of 9,118 with 1,156 deaths was reported.

The conference approved unanimously the plan for unification of the Methodist Episcopal and Methodist Episcopal church, south.

## BABY CONTEST AT INDIANA FAIR

Not for the Prettiest or Best  
Dressed But for Most  
Perfectly Formed.

INDIANAPOLIS, April 13.—One of the newest features to be added to the program for the annual state fair, to be held in Indianapolis next September, will be a better baby contest. Announcement to this effect has been made by Charles F. Kennedy, secretary of the state board of agriculture.

The contest, it was said, will not be a baby show. It will not be a dress affair and will not be for the prettiest baby. Instead, it will be for the most perfectly formed specimens of Hoosier babies and for the most healthful from a physical standpoint.

If a baby "makes a face" at a critical time in this contest, it will not be counted against him in the final reckoning, it is said. A score card system will be used and the youngsters will be judged by dentists, physicians, surgeons and baby experts. The babies will be examined before the public.

There will be two principal classes, it was said. One will be for babies under 12 months and one for babies between 12 months and 24 months. These classes are to be divided into boy and girl groups, and into three more groups—those from unincorporated towns and rural districts, those from towns and cities of less than 10,000 population and those from cities of more than 10,000 population.
