

## PRAYER MEETINGS ARE FEATURES OF EVANGELISTS WORK

Fifty Meetings Held in Homes  
Throughout City Tues-  
day Morning.

"I consider these prayer meetings one of the most important parts of my campaign" Bob Jones said Tuesday morning in referring to the 50 prayer meetings which were held in various homes throughout the city from 9 a.m. to 10 o'clock.

The meetings are to be held each Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday morning during the five weeks' campaign. Each ward of the city has a captain or leader who divides his ward into smaller districts of 4 or 10 city blocks each. These small districts, throughout the 50 meetings of the period, 9:30 to 10 o'clock, make it possible for women in the homes to attend the meetings.

Another feature of the campaign in addition to the regular tabernacle meetings are the noon shop meetings where talks are especially appropriate, are given the factory employees during the noon hour by members of the Jones party. Meetings were conducted Tuesday noon at the Sibley Mfg. Co. by Mr. and Mrs. Buntress and at the Campbell Paper Box Co. by Mr. and Mrs. Loren Jones.

"Prayer" was the subject discussed by Rev. Jones at the afternoon tabernacle meeting Tuesday. These meetings are just one hour in length, from 3 to 4 o'clock, and are so arranged that the business men need not leave.

A meeting of prayer meeting leaders was held with Mrs. Jones following the address by Bob Jones. More extensive plans for the daily prayer services were outlined.



## EARLY FIRE CAUSES INJURY TO TWO

Man Badly Burned and Wom-  
an Jumps From Second  
Story Window.

Mrs. Orpha Showers is suffering from a broken ankle, caused when she and her 19-year-old son, Donald, jumped from a second story window, and Charles Archbold is Epworth hospital, badly burned, as the result of a fire at 5 o'clock Tuesday morning at 228 W. Miller, av.

Mr. Archbold was starting the fire in the kitchen stove. He thought that there were no live coals in the stove, but when he poured kerosene oil into the stove, the occasioned flames badly burned him, and spread throughout the house.

**Jumps From Window.**

Mrs. Showers and her son, who were on the second floor, became frightened, and jumped from a second story window. Neighbors rushed to the assistance of Mrs. Showers and Mr. Archbold. The latter was rushed to the hospital. The boy escaped serious injury. Mr. Archbold was badly burned about the face, hands and body.

The house was gutted by the flames, which completely destroyed the contents before they could be removed from the burning dwelling.
