

SEEK LEADERS FOR SCOUT MOVEMENT

Hundreds of Youths Are Attending Meetings of Community Center.

A pronounced need for leaders in the boy scout movement is felt following the remarkable turnout of boys in response to the invitation to them to join the scout troops. According to Joseph W. Taylor, scout executive, hundreds of boys are attending the various meetings held at community centers and schools in the interest of the scout movement. On several occasions four or five times as many boys have come to the meetings as were expected. A number of men interested in leadership also have attended these meetings offering their assistance in carrying on the activities.

The boys are anxious to get their troops started and are handicapped by the lack of leaders. The University club and several similar organizations have offered to furnish a number of men to fill such positions, but there is a demand for still more. These men will be called upon to form advisory boards composed of six members in each community where a troop is organized, and one of them will be called upon to lead

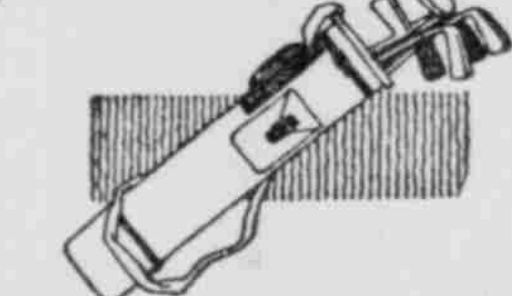
