

EIGHTEEN CASES OF SCARLET FEVER IN CITY, SAYS BOARD

Make Announcement of Contagious Diseases in City.

There are 18 cases of scarlet fever, 10 of smallpox and two of diphtheria in South Bend, according to an announcement Wednesday by Dr. Emil G. Freyermuth, secretary of the city board of health.

Two new cases of smallpox were reported to the health department Wednesday and they were taken to the city pest house. Dr. Freyermuth Wednesday issued the following statement regarding scarlet fever: "Scarlet fever is a highly contagious disease and sometimes is rapidly fatal destroying life within 48 hours after its onset. At other times it leaves the patient with defective hearing or other serious sequela.

Here Since January 1.

There has been more scarlet fever in this city since the first of January than there has in any similar period for several years. Sixteen names are in quarantine for scarlet fever at this time. Fortunately it has been very light, often evading detection until "peeling" called attention to it. It must not be forgotten that a mild case of any contagious disease may give rise to another patient to the most malignant type of the affection, or even cause a serious epidemic. Too much care must be exercised in preventing exposure to scarlet fever as there is no such preventive treat-


