

## PARSON DENOUNCES MARRIAGES; WIVES CHIEF OFFENDERS

Minister Declares He Will Beg Rather Than Perform Marriage Nuptials.

MUSKEGON, Mich., April 15.—Adjutant William John Purdue, Salvation Army leader, who gained considerable reputation as a marrying parson, says that he will beg for a living before he will take money in the future for marriages.

"I am through," said Adjutant Purdue. "Marriage conditions have been going from bad to worse for some time, until I am heartily sick with our normal conditions as they apply to marriages."

"The climax came recently when a woman arrived with her fifth husband and wanted me to perform the ceremony. I refused and I gave her a lecture, which caused her to leave quickly for another minister. Then a few days ago she did not yet 21 years old divorced her third husband in the local courts."

"Marriage is to many people just a passing fancy. They change husbands and wives as they would change automobiles in the spring. They want the latest model and when the paint is worn they feel it is time to discard."

"Women are the worst offenders

against the marriage laws. They get married on a dare in the morning and are separated in the afternoon. Dress is considered an important factor today with the women. They want to dress even if the table is without food."






