

CURTAIL SALES OF
GASOLINE LOCALLYFreight Embargo Forces
Standard Oil to Take
Drastic Measure.

Breaks in South Bend's freight embargo clouds were seen Thursday by J. H. Bremner, head of the Transportation department of the Chamber of Commerce. The traffic congestion Thursday reached into the gasoline trade, materially affecting this business.

According to Mr. Bremner, the freight congestion situation is much improved here. Mr. Bremner Thursday issued the following announcement:

"Although the embargo has been lifted by the New York Central west of Toledo no freight is being accepted for any of its connecting lines. All freight is accepted subject to delay to any point on all railroads.

Condition Improving.
"The Michigan Central railroad reports that nothing was being accepted for any point on its lines. Improved conditions are reported however.

"Shipments on the Pennsylvania and Grand Trunk roads are still being accepted for local points only but the hope is that a further lifting of embargoes would be accomplished on the roads within the next few days.

"Freight is being accepted by the N. Y. & E. I. railroad this morning for all local points on its line and some places on the Wabash railroad. Some L. O. L. shipments are being received from points outside of the designated local points.

"Reports from the offices of the Grand Trunk and the New York Central are to the effect that shipments of both perishable and dead freight was being received Thursday from Chicago."

Restrict Sales.
The Standard Oil Co. Thursday began the restriction of the sale of gasoline to pleasure and touring automobile owners. The order restricts the sale to three gallons of gasoline to each of this class of motor vehicle. There is no restriction on the sale of gasoline to auto truck and other motor vehicles hauling freight.

The restriction of the Standard Oil Co. is caused by the shortage of cars and men occasioned by the switchmen's strike.

ASSAULT CASE IS
CAUSE OF SUITMrs. Marie McCullough
Charges Husband With
Cruel Treatment.

An aftermath of an assault and battery case heard in the city court on Wednesday, April 7, when Mrs. Marie McCullough, 807 E. Third st., Mishawaka, charged her mother-in-law, Mrs. Maud Gifford, same address, with striking her with a stove poker, resulted Thursday morning when a suit for divorce was filed in the superior court by Mrs. McCullough against Ray McCullough.

The complainant charges the defendant with cruel and inhuman treatment and says that the defendant married the plaintiff on July 8, 1919, to avoid prosecution then pending for battery. Specific cases of neglect are recited in the complaint and McCullough is accused of failing to provide a home but took the plaintiff to live with his mother. Alimony to the amount of \$1,000 is asked.

In the city court action McCullough testified against his wife. The couple separated on April 3, the day the alleged assault on Mrs. McCullough is said to have occurred.

Charges Cruel Treatment.
Orville Hays is charged with cruel and inhuman treatment of his wife and is made defendant in suit for divorce filed Thursday in the superior court. The plaintiff asks for the custody of the two minor children, Garnet, aged seven, and Allen, aged two.

Charges Desertion.
Jennie Vinnidge deserted her husband, James Vinnidge, on Aug. 10, 1912, says the complaint in the divorce suit instituted Wednesday by the latter. The defendant is charged with cruel and inhuman treatment, called the plaintiff vile names and created constant strife during their five years of married life.

CORONER WAGNER
FILES VERDICTGives Factors Resulting in
Death of Mabel
Carlin.

"Mabel Carlin, 329 1-2 S. Michigan st., came to her death from combined effects of the excitement attending the fight, a full dilated stomach, partial intoxication due to whisky taken, nervous shock produced by a fall to the floor—all these factors causing a collapse of an already dilated heart," reads the verdict of Coroner Wagner following the inquest.

Mrs. Carlin was found dead by the police in her rooms early Friday morning following an alleged altercation with Mrs. Belle Baker, a maid in the Carlin rooming house. Mrs. Baker is being held on a charge of murder and her testimony during the coroner's inquest threw no light on the cause of death of Mrs. Carlin, it being shown that both were in an intoxicated condition and Mrs. Baker remembered nothing about the incidents surrounding the death. The attending physicians, Drs. Felder and Geisley, Mrs. Baker, Isaac V. Sailor of Elkhart, companion of the two women during the early part of the evening, Marie Roth, housekeeper in the Carlin house and Richard Wallace, brother of the

dead woman were examined by the coroner.

Meanwhile Mrs. Baker is being detained at the county jail pending further investigation by the police. It is not known whether a formal charge of murder will be preferred against Mrs. Baker or whether a lesser charge will be filed.
