18 YEAR OLD GIRL ATTEMPTS SUICIDE

Miss Kasimer Nobolinski Swallows Iodine When Jilted by Her Lover.

Miss Kasimer Nobolinski, 18 years old, is in a serious condition at the home of her sister, Mrs. Grace N. Jones, Lincoln way W., as the result of attempting to commit suicide.

She returned home from work yesterday shortly after noon in a despondent mood and refused to talk to her sister. She later went to her room, and drank some iodine.
