

## G. O. P. Tangles In Indiana Threaten Goodrich Control

Only Deliberate Theft of Pri-  
mary Can Save State  
House Machine.

(Special to The News-Times)  
INDIANAPOLIS, April 24.—The power of the benevolent triumvirate that has presided over the greater part of Indiana for so long a period is in the state. Marion county and the city of Indianapolis have been controlled by republicans is crumbling.

The people of the seventh district will have two opportunities to drive out of office the men who are responsible for "what has been termed the greatest failure of self-government" and there is today every indication that they will accept both opportunities.

Marion county is today irrevo-  
cably lost to the democratic party and even the republican organization  
heads realize it and quietly admit it.

The seventh district will elect a  
democrat for congress and will roll up a big majority for the democratic  
state ticket, regardless of whether J. W. Fesler, an Indianapolis candidate  
is nominated for governor by the re-  
publicans.

May Steal Primary.

Only the complete corruption of  
the Indianapolis Marion county can  
possibly prevent the downfall of the  
present republican organization, the  
nomination of a governor who is out  
of their control and the eventual col-  
lapse of the party.

Marion county is in a position to  
control the republican nomination for  
governor. The fight between  
Warren G. McCrary, an en-  
emy of McCray's organization, and J.  
W. Fesler with the party's official  
organization is going to be so close  
that Marion county's vote will de-  
cide it. Fesler will carry Marion  
county, but McCray will receive so  
many votes in Fesler's home city  
that he will not be greatly harmed  
by Fesler's loss. Whether or not  
McCray will profit by the fight  
which has been made on behalf of  
the Leonard Wood presidential

boom was initiated by a group of  
republicans who were struggling to  
retain their hold on the party and  
had control of the state and Marion  
county organization. They have  
measured their hold strength, fired  
all their ammunition and found that  
their campaign is a failure.

As a result of their struggle they  
have forced what was known as the  
Watson element of the party, and  
which included the greater part of  
the party, to get busy to protect it-  
self.

The Watson, or regular republican  
have put on their fighting clothes  
and propose to demonstrate in  
the last week of the primary  
that they constitute the republican  
party of Indiana.

They will demonstrate it by plac-  
ing Wood in third place in the  
primaries by rolling up a vote for  
McCray that will insure him the  
republican nomination for governor,  
and by defeating the Jewett-Good-  
rich organization in Marion county.

Lowden and Johnson.

The word has gone down from  
the real leaders of the republican  
party in Indiana to divide sup-  
port between H. L. Johnson and  
Gov. Lowden of Illinois. The result  
will be that Johnson and Lowden  
will run neck and neck in the  
primaries. Wood will be third, and  
Harding will almost fade from re-  
membrance.

When the convention meets it will  
be found that none of the presiden-  
tial candidates has had sufficient fol-  
lowing to elect a presidential delege-  
gate to the Chicago convention, and the  
convention will then name such dele-  
gates as can be swung to a "dark  
horse" when it is necessary. In the

meanwhile there will be much talk  
about making Lowden the nominee  
at Chicago.

**May Smash Machine.**  
The same branch of the party  
that is in control of the state dele-  
gates in reference to electing na-  
tional delegates will see that McCray  
is nominated for governor, regard-  
less of the Fesler sentiment, for  
Fesler is essentially the candidate  
of the same interests that are sup-  
porting Wood. Wood is now taking  
a whipping of their prosecution in  
attempting to control the party.

The "anti-organization" crowd in  
Marion county will be needed by the  
regulars to show that Fesler is not  
even a strong candidate in his own  
home. Therefore, the antis will be  
helped by the regulars in Marion  
county to their desire to elect the  
Goodrich-Jewett-Noss machine.

With the primary over the close  
harmony that has so long existed  
between the state administration and  
the Goodrich, the county and city  
administration under Jewett and his  
crowd will be broken.




