

REACH AGREEMENT ABOUT STUTZ STOCK

Ryan and Brokers "Short" of
Motor Issue Settle "Corner"
Fight.

NEW YORK, April 24.—An agreement was reached today between Allan A. Ryan and brokers short of Stutz Motor stock when trading was suspended on the New York stock exchange.

The settlement price agreed upon was \$425 a share plus stock dividends, making a total of \$550 a share.

Trading in Stutz stock was suspended after a sensational rise from \$100 to \$400 a share within a few days. The board of governors declared a "corner" existed.

Ryan, who held long contracts resigned from membership in the stock exchange and declared he would fight the action of the board. Brokers short of Stutz stock formed an organization to protect their interests and it was announced a committee representing this organization which reached the agreement with Ryan today.

Immediately after the trading was suspended on the exchange, trading was started on the curb market with quotations around \$700 a share.

YOUNGEST FORGER IS RELEASED TO PARENTS

Jaeger, according to police, passed a check on a grocery who remembered a similar one that was had a few weeks ago. Other forged checks which the police said the youth admitted writing after saying boy companions gave them to him to pass, were found in his pocket, it was asserted.

CANADA NOT OFFERED MANDATE FOR AMERICA

OTTAWA, Ont., April 24.—Canada has not been offered the mandate for Armenia, it was stated authoritatively here today. The Canadian government has no desire to accept such a mandate, it was said.

COAL MEN FIGHTING LOWER FREIGHT RATES TO KEEP PRICE UP

WASHINGTON, April 24.—Coal men are fighting the bill to grant lower coal freight rates in summer because they fear it would rob them of the excuse to raise prices during winter scarcity. Sen. Frolinghysen, New Jersey, author of the measure, said today.

"Under the present disorganized system we have a coal shortage every winter which enables coal men to boost their prices," the senator said. "They don't want to see this evil corrected because it would deprive them of a chance to further gouge the consumer."

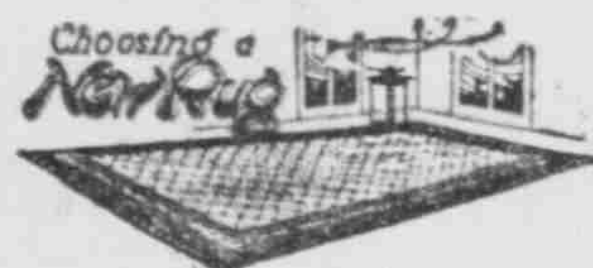
