

## HIDES BEHIND MASK OF RIGHTEOUSNESS

Goodrich Gang May be Forced Into Open by Inefficiency Charges.

INDIANAPOLIS, April 26.—The republican administration of Indiana is having a lot of difficulties in hiding behind the mask of righteousness which its satellites are in the habit of raising whenever some particularly vicious piece of inefficiency or worse comes to public gaze.

So thoroughly shaken has been the public confidence in Goodrich and its conduct of state institutions that charges of impropriety, neglect or misconduct from any source are being believed and it is no longer sufficient for the state administration to assert its cleanliness and declare them false.

**Denial Not Enough.**  
The people of Indiana are demanding investigation of every charge and whenever the Goodrich controlled gang seeks to deny the charges it is met with the assertion that if they are not true there should be an investigation in which it is proved that they are false.

The Goodrich administration does not dare investigate itself and the predicament in which it is placed by the lack of weight of its denials is no less than would be produced by admission of charges made.

For example, Charles O. McNulty, a blind tiger operator, who was paroled by Gov. Goodrich, rose up to declare that prisoners were mistreated at the penal farm. The governor attempted to deny it, declaring that he had visited the penal farm often and had never seen anything of that kind.

**Investigation Is Demanded.**  
The denial did not stick. Newspapers all over the state are demanding an investigation of the charges and men who have been at the penal farm are writing in their testimony in support of McNulty's declarations.

Gov. Goodrich must defend himself and the penal farm and he is very, very loath to have an investigation of it in the open, where his own relations to its conduct can be brought out.

The failure of the state board of charities and corrections to investigate the conditions which have been exposed at the Marion county jail has hurt the state administration immensely. No denial of this failure was possible owing to the federal court action, and the inefficiency of the entire administration of the county and the state has stood out as the leading feature of the expose.

**Would Muzzle Press.**

The Marion county exposure of Goodrichism are now trying hard to kick up a counter agitation. They have charged a lawyer who exposed their improper grand jury methods with obtaining a fee from a client under false pretenses, but they have asked three continuances when he demanded an immediate trial.

They have attempted to muzzle newspaper men for contempt of court following the publication of this lawyer's story, but after a week of delay the newspaper found it necessary to prod them into action on the contempt proceedings.

In the meanwhile Amos Butler, secretary of the state board of charities, has been supplied with additional information regarding the penal farm and is sitting in a very trying position.

He cannot hold a public hearing on the charges without exposing the Goodrich administration of which he is a part.

He cannot convince anyone that the charges are not true without holding just such an investigation.

## START SEARCH FOR DAKOTA MURDERERS

TURTLE LAKE, N. D., April 26.—Search for the murderer of seven persons here Saturday night was begun Monday by authorities. Footprints along the shore of a duck pond and the stock of a shotgun found nearby were the only clues.

The murdered included Jacob Wolf, wealthy farmer, his wife, their four daughters and a hired man. Robbery was believed to have been the motive. The seven were slain either with a shotgun or a small hatchet.

The only surviving member of the Wolf family today was an eight-month-old baby—crying in its crib at a neighbor's house.

The body of Mrs. Wolf, three of her daughters and the hired man had been thrown in the cellar. The body of the father and a daughter were covered with hay in a cowshed.
