

SOLDIERS GUARD ROADS TO FIUME

Travellers Must Show Pass-
ports Frequently to Get
by the Carabinieri.

TRIESTE, April 27.—The road to Fiume is set with "traps" to catch the wandering adventurer. Nine posts of carabinieri are placed along the way of 43 miles from Trieste and passports and other documents are examined with the closest scrutiny at each. An automobile cannot pass the post unless the man on watch has consented and raises a wooden gate similar to those at an American railroad crossing.

Seven of the "traps" are on the Italian regular command's side of the route and two on d'Annunzio's side. There are three within five miles of Trieste and the remaining four are scattered at about equal distances apart for the rest of the way until the poet's frontier is reached. At the poet's frontier, the regular carabinieri cease and the vice of the local zone guarding the armistice line and if the traveler has not got it, he is sent to the headquarters of the nearest carabinieri command, which is located at Abbazia, two miles away.

Show Pass. The wanderer to Fiume must satisfy the carabinieri officers, who are the military police of Italy, that his mission to the poet's stronghold is legitimate, otherwise the visa is refused. The visa given, one must return to the last post on the frontier for the final examination before being admitted to the No Man's land between the two forces. The crossing of No Man's land is made especially romantic by the nature of the terrain, which is woody and rocky and situated on a hill running down into the sea. Reaching the d'Annunzio lines a careful examination takes place of the mission to Fiume. Scrutinizing of passports ensues and questions are asked about "What are you doing here?" Baggage is examined and false money looked for because of the recent falsifications of bank notes in the city. The word is given to "go forward" and then one passes for another examination along practically the same line to other group of d'Annunzio soldiers perhaps a hundred yards from the first. After passing this, there are no more examinations or posts in the city, except at the stations and wharves.

neers travel aboard it and make a minute scrutiny of their charges. At Abbazia, all must detain, bag and baggage. The baggage is given a thorough search by the armed custom house guards. Then the passengers to Fiume are ushered into another room, where they are searched.

conduct another examination. When d'Annunzio first entered Fiume, no one was allowed to pass into the city. It was necessary to evade carabinieri and guards day and night. Today even searchlights play upon the various approaches to prevent anyone "running the guard line."

STEAMER STARTS ON LONG VOYAGE

Departure of White Star Liner
Recalls Historic Fore-
runner of 1854.

SYDNEY, April 27.—Departure from here recently of the White Star liner Megantic for Liverpool by way of New Zealand, the Panama canal, the West Indies and New York, recalls her historic forerunner of 1854. This vessel, the Golden Age, was a wooden paddle-wheel steamer, belonging to the New York and Australian Steam Navigation Co. The intention of the company was to run six vessels "via Panama," the Panama railroad, capitalized at \$7,000,000, being the connecting link on the then undivided isthmus, with the West India Royal Mail Steam Packet Co. running from Southampton.

the isthmus and other causes, conspired to defeat the company's plans. The Golden Age was commanded by Lieut. D. D. Porter, of the United States navy, who afterwards became famous as a Union admiral during the Civil war.

The Golden Age left Melbourne for Panama via Sydney and Tahiti, May 5, 1854. She reached Sydney on May 11 with 300 passengers. Her cargo included a consignment of gold dust and she reached England in 66 days.

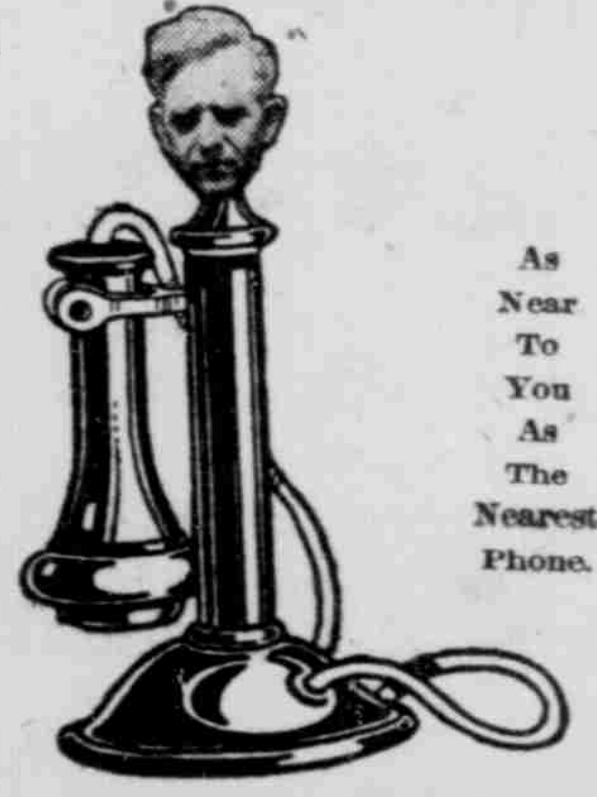
