

Y M C A. TO HOLD OPEN HOUSE WEEK FOR SCHOOL BOYS

Special Program of Events
Arranged by Junior
Secretary.

School boys in South Bend and Mishawaka between the ages of 10 and 18, will be entertained by the Y. M. C. A. Dec. 13 to Dec. 18 with an "open house week" according to an announcement by C. W. Gardner, boys' secretary for the association. Boys from the various schools have been assigned days on which they are to be allowed membership privileges and will be entertained with a program consisting of movies, basketball and swimming.

The Y. M. C. A. expects more than 1,500 boys to take advantage of the invitation and face have been distributed to all eligible boys in the various schools. City Supt. of Schools W. W. Borden and Supt. R. J. Horton of the Mishawaka schools have approved the plan and the entertainment is to be free. The Y. M. C. A. is offering "open house week" as a Christmas gift to the school boys of South Bend and Mishawaka.

After Time to Schools.
On Monday, Dec. 13, at 3:30 o'clock in the afternoon, the Colfax, Dequillard, Elder, Franklin and Lafayette school boys who are eligible for the program, will visit the Y. M. C. A. and be entertained. On Tuesday afternoon boys of the Kaley, Laurel, Lincoln and Linden schools will be received at 3:30 o'clock. Boys from the Mishawaka grade schools will come to the association building Wednesday afternoon at 3:30 o'clock and the Mishawaka junior and senior high school will be entertained at 7 o'clock that evening.

Thursday afternoon the Madison, Oliver, River Park and Studebaker school children have been invited to enjoy membership privileges and the entertainment offered. Boys of the Michigan, Muesel, Perley and Washington schools will be received Friday afternoon at 3:30 o'clock and the South Bend high school will come Saturday afternoon, according to the schedule.

WANT CHILDREN BACK IN SCHOOL

Vocational Guidance Department Devotes Time to Truant City Students.

Getting children under 16 years of age, who have been working in the industries of the city and who are now out of employment due to the present period of depression, back in the schools, is the chief occupation of the city school vocational guidance department, according to its director, Miss Helen Dernbach Tuesday.

"Many of the minor children who are now out of work are to be found on the streets instead of in school where they are required to be when not working under permits in the city," said Miss Dernbach, "and we are finding it necessary in some cases to use court procedure to force the children to attend school."

According to the report of the vocational guidance department of the city schools, six boys and nine girls under the age of 16 years, have registered with that office for work between Nov. 22 to Dec. 4. Ten boys and seven girls over that age have also registered. One boy and eight girls in the junior section have been asked for by employers, whereas one boy and six girls above that age were wanted between Nov. 22 and Dec. 4. Seven boys and 14 girls in the junior section have been referred to employers and eight boys and seven girls in the senior section have been interviewed by employers. Four boys and eight girls in the junior section have secured employment through the department's help.

SEARCH FOR BOY, 17, LURED FROM HOME

Youth Brought to City by Friend Is Sought by Parents.

Attracted from his home by offer of fabulous wealth in South Bend John Andrejak, 17 years old of McKeesport, Pa., came to this city last week with several friends and was then deserted.

The youth wrote to his parents and informed them of his plight. His father came to the city Tuesday morning, but was unable to find his stranded son. He went to police headquarters and with the aid of Hummer Officer A. Moore searched in vain for the boy.

The father explained that his son had never been away from home for any length of time and he fears for his safety.
