

CITY'S PARKS AND BOULEVARDS COST \$53,000 FOR YEAR

Total Disbursements Do Not Include Costs Attendant to Natatorium.

Development and maintenance of the city's park and boulevard system, under the control of the board of park commissioners, cost \$53,953.52 during the year 1921, according to a compilation of disbursements issued by Supt. Arthur P. Perley.

Total disbursements for the year do not include the costs attendant to the construction of the Engmann City natatorium, but covers all improvements of a permanent nature as well as maintenance costs for the year just ended.

The annual report of the park department, which will be in the public future will include several important undertakings initiated or completed during the past year, principal of which are the building of a public bath house on W. Washington av., and considerable progress in completing the final stretches of roadway connecting up the proposed eight-mile river boulevard.

Is Nearly Completed.

This boulevard, designed to effect a broad paved thoroughfare from Mishawaka city limits to the Heathwin bridge, nearly four miles downstream to follow the natural line of the St. Joseph river, has been completed with the exception of one or two minor parcels of land. Less than a quarter of a mile is now owned by the city. The remaining tracts will be added to the system, it is planned in the very near future.

During the year condemnation proceedings were instituted by the department to secure a parcel of ground on High st. between Dubuque and Dayton sts., to connect Studebaker park with the city park system, a strip of ground lying between Angola and Riverside parks, and a strip east of the Sample st. bridge, extending from Sample st. bridge to Fifth st. River Park.

In addition, the park department contracted the purchase of three lots adjoining Studebaker park.

The year has been a successful one for the municipal golf links. More than 25,000 played on the links the past 12 months, the report shows.

The city park system contains a total of 396 acres.

Local License Bureau to Accommodate Applicants During Evening Hours.

In order to accommodate those who have so far found it impossible to visit the office during the day to receive their 1922 license plates, the Hoosier State Automobile association, in charge of the issuance of the plates at the office of William H. Bapp, 207 S. Main st., announces that the office will be open Thursday and Saturday evenings, Jan. 5 and 7, from 6 o'clock until 8 o'clock.

Machine owners are still crowding into the office, and at times applicants are forced to stand outside the door for a time before they can get into the office to fill out application blanks. Since the announcement that those displaying 1921 plates will be "picked up" by the state and local police after Jan. 10 tardy applicants have made haste to appear at the office, and the number taken care of each day since Jan. 1, have exceeded those who completed their transactions before the end of last year.

The office is to be maintained by the association as long as it is necessary, for the accommodation of the motorists in this district.


