Saturday of this week, the Vigil of Pentecost is a day of fast and abstinence.

Next week we have Ember Days—Wednesday, Friday and Saturday are days of fast and abstinence.

On May 30th, our Most Reverend Bishop Ritter will celebrate his twenty-fifth anniversary in the Priesthood. A letter read at all the Masses Sunday stated that he did not wish any public ceremonies, but each and everyone in every one of the churches in his diocese will be offering up their prayers for him. It is a coincidence that on the same day, the same month, the same year, that our Most Reverend Bishop was ordained a priest that our Most Holy Father, the Pope was made a Bishop.

The hour of the Novena held on Wednesday evening has been changed from seven-thirty to eight o'clock. What can we say to arouse in our people the desire to attend these Novena services—to come and pray for our soldiers. Father Lindemann's short sermon was very good last Wednesday. He pictured the difference between what we do in the death of some of our friends here at home—how much—and how little we seem to be doing for the many, many of our friends who are dying on the battlefields. Yes, they all are our friends. Are they not laying down their lives for us. And are we not taught that there is no greater love than to lay down our lives for our fellowmen. Our chapel is filled three times a day on Sunday, yes and over-flowing at the eight-thirty Mass—why can't it be filled for the Novena services just once on Wednesday evenings.
