Mr. DuVall died Wednesday, May 8 in Methodist Hospital. He was born in Kentucky, but had lived in Indianapolis 40 years. For 12 years he was employed at Diamond Chain Co., where he held a number of jobs, including machine operator.

He attended a beauty school and for about 10 years operated a beauty shop at 31st and North-western.

Mr. DuVall was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Clyde DuVall, both of whom were blind. From early childhood he was a guide for his parents. His mother died last September and his father last December.

Services were Saturday in Farley Speedway Funeral Home, with burial in Crown Hill Cemetery. The widow, Eva G. DuVall, survives.

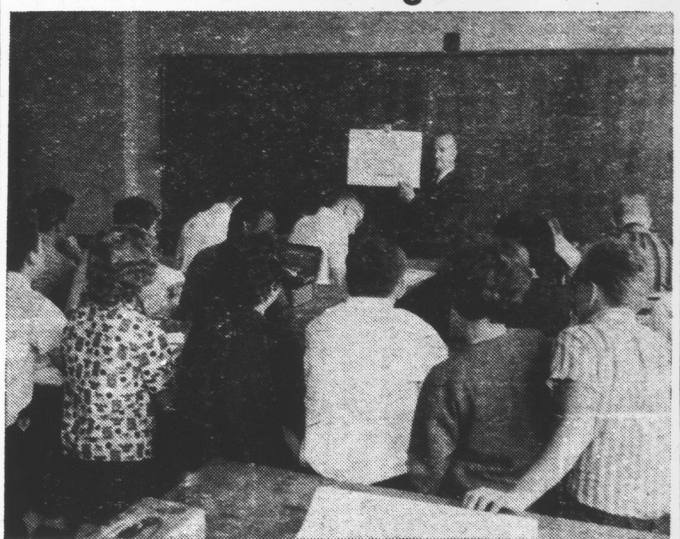
