BICYCLE SAFETY

Floyd A. Kine, Sr., Director of the Indiana Office of Traffic Safety, in issuing a special message on bicycle safety, asked Hoosier parents to require their children to develop and practice safe riding habits.

"The laws that apply to drivers

also apply to bike riders," he said. "A safe rider is more likely to be a safe driver later. The child who learns and practices fulfilling the requirements of the law when bicycling is, in reality, taking part in an early phase of a driver training program."

He pointed out that in 1967, 24 Hoosier youngsters, ages 14 and

younger, were killed in bicycle accidents, and another 1038 were injured. Any of the injury accidents with a little less luck, could have been fatal.

In addition to complying with the laws for the drivers of motorized vehicles, i.e., riding with the flow of traffic and giving regulation arm signals, a bicyclist

1. Ride on the regular seat attached to the bike.

2. Carry only the number of persons for which the bike is designed and equipped.

3. Not attach the bike or himself to any vehicle upon the roadway. Hitching a ride can be disastrous.

4. Ride no more than two abreast on streets and highways.


5. Keep both hands on the handle bars.

6. Ride with lights on at night.
