New York—Surveys indicate that visitors to the New York World's Fair 1939 will be able to obtain desirable accommodation in any price range. There are 133,334 hotel rooms in the city; hosteries in suburban communities have 50,000 rooms; Y. M. C. A. clubhouses and similar semi-public institutions provide 40,000, and those in apartments and rooming houses add 120,000 more. Thus, the total transient accommodation is 343,334 rooms.


