ELKHART COUNTY FAIR  
FEATURES MANY PRIZES

Residents of Kosciusko county are eligible to exhibit at the Elkhart County Fair in Goshen, the week of August 29 to September 2, in the various open class departments.

In all classes other than livestock, the only requirement is the purchase of a \$1.00 exhibitors ticket which admits holder entire week, and patron may exhibit as many articles as desired for cash awards. Some \$1,000 will be paid out to winners in livestock, agriculture and horticulture, culinary, fine and domestic arts, and other items.

In livestock classes, four animals may be entered under the exhibitor ticket rule with a 25-cent additional fee for each horse, cow, sheep or swine shown for a premium.

Any exhibitor may enter three articles under one class if desired and can win more than one prize if there is worthy competition. If only entry, second prem-

ium only is paid. All stock or articles must be raised or be the work of the exhibitor.

Plans are rapidly formulating for the fair in both the entertainment branches and educational interests.

Season tickets have been placed on sale in both Syracuse and Milford in Kosciusko county for only \$1.00 admitting two persons the entire week. The tickets may be purchased at either Thornburg's Drug Store or Wayne's Grill in Syracuse.
