JAPANESE BEETLES ARE FOUND IN SEVEN CITIES

Trapping to discover the presence of Japanese beetle, being conducted in 17 Hoosier cities this summer by the Department of Conservation in cooperation with the U. S. Department of Agriculture, has resulted in the finding of beetles in seven cities, Virgil M. Simmons, commissioner of the Department of Conservation, said today.

Beetles have been found at Indianapolis, Logansport, Bluffton, Muncie, Richmond, Fort Wayne and Warsaw, with the largest number trapped at Indianapolis, Logansport and Fort Wayne. The survey will be discontinued this month when the beetles end their flying stage.
