LIVESTOCK NEWS

(Reported by John Clay and Company.)

Light fat cattle—steers or heifers—continue to meet relatively better outlet than stronger weight steers, the market of late covering the latter class being under constant pressure owing to the proportionately larger share available, although prices show no material change on recent sessions. Favorable feeding weather and feed plentitude are curtailing the receipts of under weight hogs. Range lambs are fading from the market picture.

Range cattle receipts this season will go down on record as the smallest in the history of the Chicago market. The abnormally light supply of western killing beeves is naturally aiding the sale of cheaper natives and confining all slaughter beeves to a narrow price spread. The offering of stocker and feeder steers is meeting with active demand. Practical top on yearling stockers is \$10.75, with calves up to \$11. Little in the replacement cattle line is available below \$8. Feeder lambs are bulking at \$8.50 @ 9.

Slaughter of hogs thus far in October has slackened materially, being slightly less than a year earlier. This is the first falling off in a long time, comparing one month's kill with the same period of a year earlier. The abbreviated

HOOSIER ANGLERS FIND AUTUMN FISHING GOOD

Autumn weather has brought a new interest in fishing to Hoosier anglers, Virgil M. Simmons, commissioner of the Department of Conservation, said recently, with the result that some exceptional catches have been reported during the last few days.

Experienced anglers claim that fishing is better during the fall months, asserting that with cooler weather, the fish are more active and provide better sport. With fall rains aiding in clearing the streams, fishing has improved in most sections of the state.

kill with its market shortage of under weights leads to the belief that stock is being held back, since it is a foregone conclusion that pig production the last two years was substantially larger than two preceding years.

That our export business in live stock edibles is not to improve in the near future—the liability incident to present conditions not necessarily the deterrent—is graphically illustrated by Great Britain's recently concluded negotiations with the Argentine, calling for 170,000 tons of chilled and frozen beef and 30,000 tons of frozen mutton.
