25 Years Ago...
From the Files of The Journal

FEB. 20, 1919

Gov. Goodrich signed the
presidential suffrage bill Feb. 6,
thus completing the process by
means of which women citizens in
Indiana will vote for presidential
electors in 1920.

The marriage of Atty. Donald
Vanderveer, son of Atty. Richard
Vanderveer of Milford, and Hazel
A. Scarfoss, daughter of Tom Scarfoss,
Syracuse, was solemnized on
Saturday in Milford.

We think the elections prove two
things:

1. The New Deal is withering at
the grass roots and the people are
determined to kill its roots in Wash-
ington although its leaders have
endeavored to graft a new limb on the
plant.

2. The Republican march to
victory which began a few years back
is picking up speed as the time
