HOOSIERS
IN
WASHINGTON

Following are highlights of the dramatic keynote address of House Majority Leader Charles A. Halleck before the recent Wisconsin Republican State Convention:

The signs are plain. We are going to win in '48.

The people said last November that we were right. They have had abundant evidence since that by entrusting government to the sound hands of the Republican Party can the wise will of the people be carried out.

The country has had enough of:

High Tax Harry.
His Spend, and Spend for his overstuffed Bureaucracy.

His abuse of the presidential veto power to thwart the demands of the people.

Across the land the people are voicing their wrath against the subservience of Truman and his Administration to the radical masters of the Democratic Party.

After fourteen years of "rubber-stamp" Congress...you have a Republican Congress that is responding to the heart's desire of the American people. Our only trouble is that the President—the last bulwark of repudiated New Dealism—is stubbornly trying to block our way.

The basic political objective of the Republican program is to restore sanity and order in government and to restore the government to the people. The basic economic objective is to create a stable economic climate in which American ingenuity, inventive

genius and productive ability will flourish.

And we must not and shall not rest until we have attained our objectives.

That is our pledge. We shall redeem that pledge—veto or no veto, and New Dealers, Communists, spendthrift bureaucrats, political machine bosses and labor racketeers, to the contrary notwithstanding. We have just begun to fight for the people's rights.

In reducing government costs the Republican Congress has received absolutely no co-operation from President Truman. The inescapable fact is that this Democratic administration simply does not believe in economy. All they want to do is shovel out the taxpayers' money for every conceivable sort of operation whether it is worthwhile or not. And particularly do they want to shovel it out where it can make them some votes.

The Republicans do not feel that way about it. We don't think the voters are for sale on the auction block of easy money out of Washington.

There is no place in the federal service for those who do not be-

lieve in the American way of life. The era of coddling Communists in the highest strategic and policy-making jobs in Washington is now definitely at an end.

By vetoing the tax relief bill, which passed both the House and the Senate by substantial majorities, the President has thwarted the will of the people, as expressed through their recently elected representatives in Congress. It was a flagrant abuse of the veto power. The determination of tax policy has always been regarded as the special province of Congress, not to be set aside by the Executive.

The Republican majority in Congress flatly rejects the argument of President Truman in his tax bill veto message that the government must continue to impose back-breaking, war-time taxes.

Likewise, we spurn his specious argument that the Government must take heavily of the people's money and spend it.

He says that if the government spends the money, the effect will not be inflationary. But if the people who earned the money spend it, he says then that the same money will be inflationary. That is just sheer nonsense.
