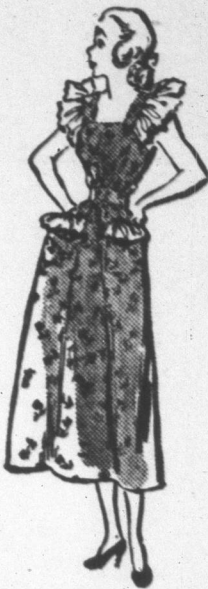

Frank Maloy, who has been confined to his bed for the past five weeks in the home of his daughter, Mrs. Charlotte McSweeney, is slowly improving.

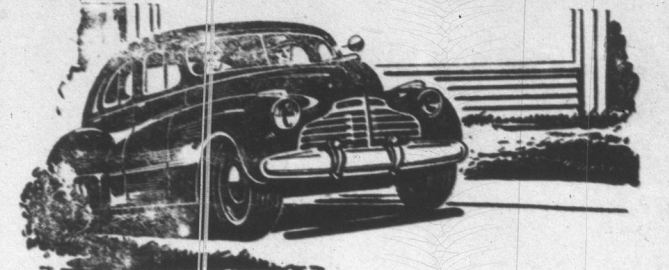
