### Syracuse Lake News

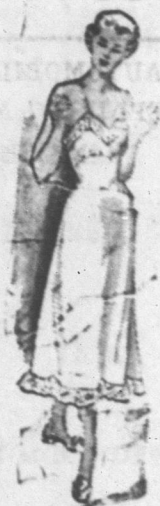

### Riley Hospital Treats Nearly One-Third of Indiana's Polio Victims As Indiana Carries Out The Riley Centennial Research Fund Campaign
