25 Years Ago—March 7, 1929.



STATE HOLDS TRAFFIC VIOLATIONS TO MINIMUM

Indiana's concentrated traffic safety campaign last year held motoring deaths to 1,277, the same as 1952, State Police Supt. Frank A. Jessup announced this week. Rural and suburban smashups, where higher speeds increase the severity, accounted for 921 of the victims.

Fatalities per 100 million miles of travel dropped from 8.0 to 7.3, even though more drivers and vehicles caused the total miles driven on Hoosier roads to jump 8.4 percent to 17,296,000,000 miles. A total of 33,650 other persons


