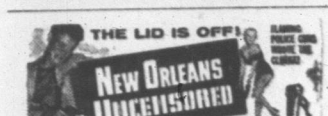

6 Milford Farmers Sign Oil Land Leases

Milford farm owners, Lee R. Cory, R. E. Slabaugh, Cleveland R. Shuder, Arron Wise, William Hartner and Everett Butrick, have signed leases between themselves and the Severns Oil company, of California, according to Wednesday's Warsaw Times-Union.

A few weeks ago the oil company started drilling for oil on the old Werley farm, now owned by Raymond Pinkerton. A company spokesman reported that the leases give the company the exclusive mineral and oil rights on these properties.

The new drilling operation is about three-fourths of a mile west of the old well drilled back in 1934.
