## State Police Expand Highway Patrol Plan

Effective Friday 15 March, an expanded Indiana State Police traffic policy of direct enforcement and public education by troopers will be inaugurated to stem the tide of highway tragedies. Troopers will resume patrols on secondary roads and in small towns.

"Our objective is to educate the public as to what constitutes hazardous driving and encourage driver improvement," Superintendent Harold S. Zeis explained.

Director Albert E. Huber, of the Indiana Office of Traffic Safety, said that "under certain conditions the written remainder has an educational value." His department is continuing its vigorous public safety education program in cooperation with the State Police.

"Wolfpack" trooper patrols, airplane patrols and electrically-controlled speed timers will be used on main highways. Radar speed timers will be added in the near future.

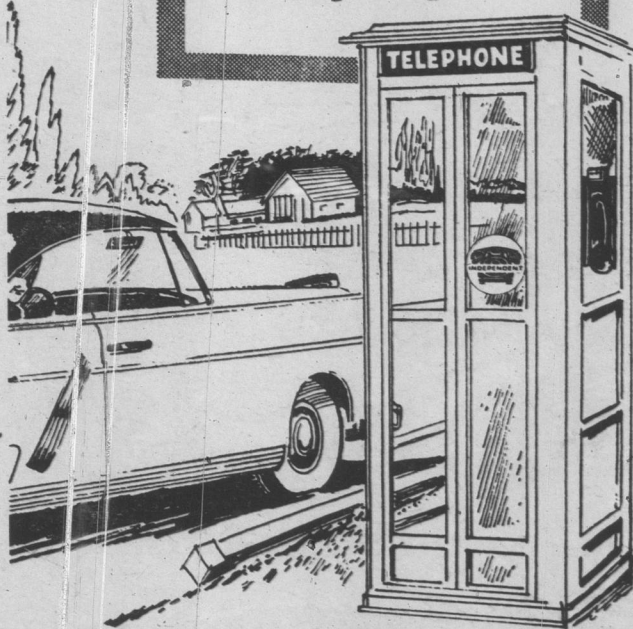
