Fifty mothers and daughters attended the Mother and Daughter Banquet at the North Webster Legion Hall Tuesday night.

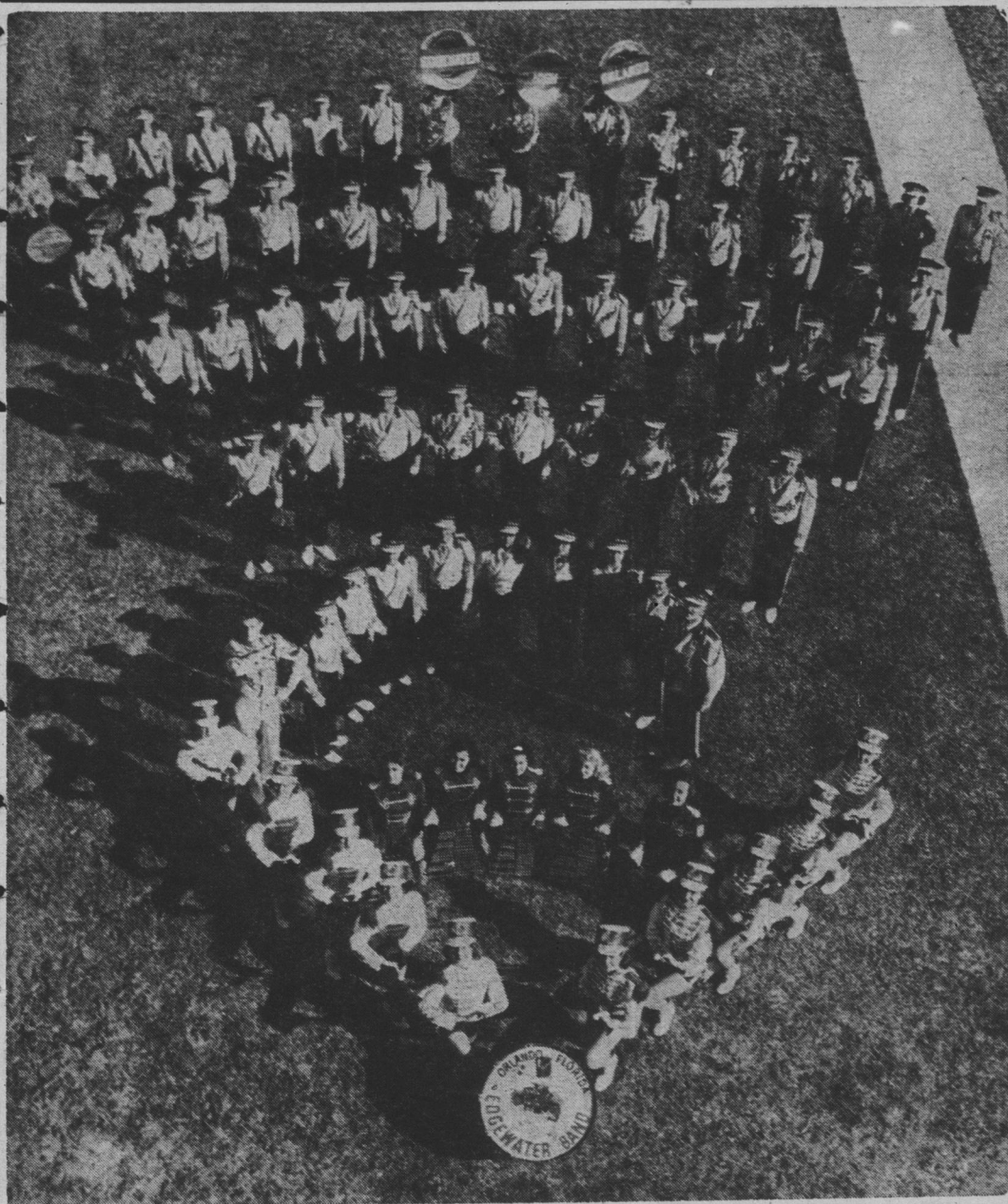
