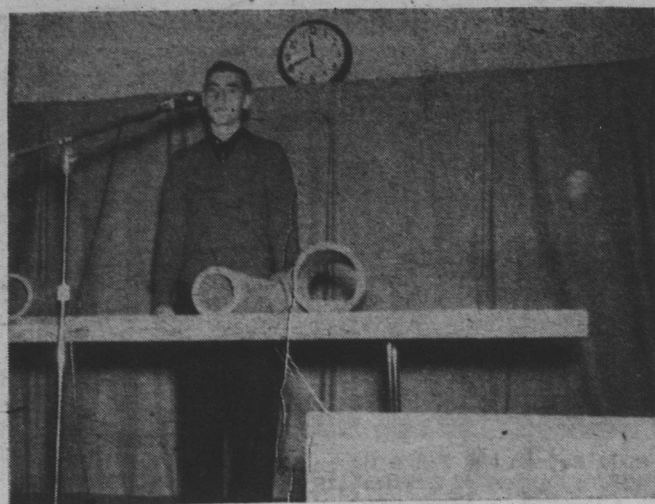

As a reward for his efforts Ronnie will receive an all expense paid trip to Springfield, Illinois, 8 December to present his demonstration in the national contest.

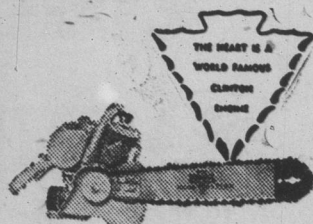
