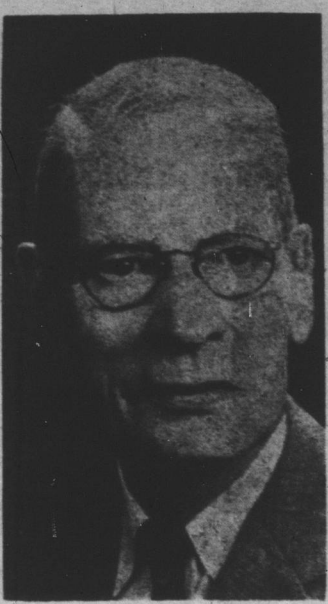

Retiring from the men's furnishings field after more than 55 years of service, H. Guy Hays of Jerks Socks, Inc., was presented with an engraved gold watch by Harry D. Liebschutz, president of the Cincinnati firm. Mr. Hays, now 72, will divide his retirement between his Wawasee Lake home, and Largo, Florida. He entered business in 1902 with Sheldon Dry Goods in Columbus Ohio. Several years later he joined Marshall Field and Company's wholesale division, remaining there for more than 30 years—until the division's liquidation. In 1945 Mr. Hays became associated with Jerks Socks, covering Indiana, a territory he had served continuously since 1913. Mr. and Mrs. Hays have three children and eight grandchildren.

Phone To Millersburg Now On Toll Basis

Long distance phone service to Millersburg originating from Syracuse and Milford, is now on a toll basis according to recent announcement of W. D. Sadler, district manager of the United Telephone Company of Indiana, Inc.

Under authorization of the Public Service Commission of Indiana, Millersburg was eliminated as a "Free Service" point, effective 1 January 1958. Syracuse subscribers will place their calls in the usual long distance manner. Milford subscribers calling Millersburg, should dial "O" and place calls thru the Warsaw long distance operators.
