



This letter was received several weeks ago. Lack of space has precluded its publication until now.

Editor, Journal:

After the breakup of the rendezvous on the island of the teen-age beer parties many persons have come to me saying they knew this was going on for a long time. Things just cannot exist if people knowing of it and doing nothing about it, and you now have township officers who will do something about anything unlawful. There was very little publicity, no names, no arrests, no broken hearted parents to face the fact it was one of their sons and daughters who was or who has attended these drinking parties lasting until the early hours of morning. Do you parents know where and with whom your children are when they came home after mid-night? The raid was tipped off by 7 boys in a boat the oldest 15 years of age with a bottle containing liquor thrown into the lake to get rid of the evidence and the time was after mid-night. They came from far and near by car and by boat and information furnished they have been able to buy beer and liquor from a couple of boys peddling it out of a car, and many of the big parties were promoted by a 17 year old Indianapolis girl.

Last Saturday evening three blond boys about 14 years of age loitered around the South Shore Hotel lobby until about

9 p.m. as they left each picked up a chair from an umbrella set on the front bank and started running for their boat at the hotel pier. They dropped the chairs when someone shouted and roared away in their boat. Mr. C. E. Richardson, Elkhart, Indiana, had two valuable chairs (\$150.00) each stolen from his boat a few weeks ago. This vandalism and stealing just will not be tolerated. If you see anyone acting suspiciously report immediately to Constable Jack D. Clark Ph. 105 or to Bud L. Cripe Ph 303-R, Frank Putt or Elmo Burson. These men are township law enforcement officers, live in our community, serve without pay, and available at all times willing to help, in any way to counsel these youngsters. The time to help is before things happen and its from this premise these men are trying to operate.

Know where and with whom your children are at all times save your self the sorrow if one of your sons or daughters are brought home by an officer from one of these drinking parties. Just learned a group gathered one night last week end on Mason's Point burned the scaffolding and a ladder from a house under-construction nearby. You parents now know they are still trying to get away with flaunting the law. They will be arrested venued to Juvenile Court and you may rest assured The Honorable Seth E. Rowdabaugh will have something very interesting to say to them.
