Notice is hereby given that the Town Board of Trustees of the town of Syracuse, Indiana will accept bids for the purchase of a Chlorination Unit for the Weatherhead pump station in Town of Syracuse; also a booster pump, scales, gas mask, test kit and other necessary accessories from the date of this notice until the hour of 7:30 P.M. (fast time) March 17, 1959, at which time and hour the bids will be opened and examined and a contract for said purchase of above equipment given to the lowest and best bidder.

The chlorination unit is to be connected with a 350 gallon per minute pump at above said water pumping station, and in full working order.

Each bid shall be submitted upon the prescribed form 95 and the non-collusion affidavit shall be executed. Each bid shall be accompanied by a bidders bond or certified check in the amount of at least ten (10%) per cent of the bid made.

Bids shall be sealed and submitted to the President of the Town Board of Trustees, marked "bid for Chlorinator."
