ARLISS HAMMAN WITH "OPERATION BIG LAND"

Arlliss D. Hamman, hospital corpsman third class, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. James Hamman of 206 N. Huntington st., Syracuse Indiana, landed with the 1st Marine Brigade on the beaches of Camp Pendleton in Southern California on 1 April marking the start of "Operation Big Land", a coordinated surface-air amphibious assault exercise.

The Hawaii-based Marines left Kaneohe in mid-March on amphibious ships returning from the Western Pacific. A short time will be spent at Camp Pendleton for field exercises before the beginning of "Big Land."

Additional Marines from Pendleton and the 3rd Marine Air Wing at El Toro, California, will join about 5,000 Navy men and 25 ships in the exercise, designed to improve their professional skills in the conduct of amphibious warfare in the atomic age.

"Big Land" will get underway with a bombardment of San Clemente Island by the fire support unit.

A mock invasion of Camp Pendleton will be carried out to recapture an "Aggressor" offshore island for the purpose of establishing a base to hinder further enemy operations.

An assault helicopter-aircraft carrier will lift fully equipped Marines to the shore employing the "Vertical Envelopment" version of assault landing.

On the completion of "Big Land," 10 April the 5,500 members of the Brigade will again take part in field exercises before returning to Hawaii during the last week of April.
