Services for T. Peter Plew, 71, custodian of the Syracuse schools for 27 years, were held Saturday afternoon in the Syracuse Church of the Brethren. The Rev. Harlan Smith officiated and burial was in the North Webster cemetery.

Mr. Plew died Thursday in the Goshen hospital following a serious illness of one week. He had been in failing health for several months.


