Their feeling is that they would like to have fireworks in Syracuse on the fourth of July and they are willing to help in the cost. If there are enough other organizations and individuals in town who feel the same way, then let's have them.

In this case, the making of the fireworks has created work for those who make them; it has furnished pleasure to the thousands who have seen them; it has given the people of Syracuse an opportunity to invite their out of town friends to enjoy the fireworks with them; and it has given the Town of Syracuse favorable advertising.


