In United States Service

In Naval Review

James L. Spitler, aviation
machinist's mate airman, USN,
son of Mr. and Mrs. Don Spitler
of Route 1, Kale Island, serving
with Heavy Attack Squadron
Four, took part in a full-scale
naval review and visit to San
Francisco, 17-20 July after com-
pleting a major exercise held off
the California coast.

The 15,000 men and 26 ships
of the U.S. First Fleet were re-
viewed by Admiral Herbert G.
Hopwood, USN, the Commander-
in-chief of the U. S. Pacific Fleet,
as they passed under the Golden
Gate bridge.

The exercise which preceded
the San Francisco visit involved
fastmoving aggressive attack
carrier teams which struck at
simulated mainland targets as
naval air patrols squadrons and
submarines held the defensive
roll.

Exercises of this type are de-
signed to give advance training
to personnel preparing to make
cruises with the U.S. Seventh
Fleet in the Western Pacific.

At Fort Campbell

Cadet James C. Connolly II, of
Syracuse, a member of the class
of 1961 at the U.S. Military Acad-
emy at West Point, N.Y., is un-
dergoing a period of summer
training with paratroopers of the
101st Airborne Division at Fort
Campbell, Ky. The training is

Corps (STRAC), is one of the
high points of his tour with the
academy.


