Change in Schedules
Is Effective Sunday

New passenger train schedules will go into effect Sunday on the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad, according to Agent Charles A. Caple.

Westbound trains will leave Syracuse at 5:10 a.m. local time, and at 1:15 p.m. Eastbound train from Chicago will be at 2:33 p.m. A second eastbound train, from Chicago, arrives here approximately 2 a.m., but only stops to discharge passengers, and does not run from Chicago on Sunday night.

The schedule changes coincide with the change to Daylight Saving Time of a number of cities. Syracuse and most of northeastern Indiana have remained on fast time all year for some time now.


