Pierceton's powerhouse Cubs porved too much for the Syracuse trackteam last Friday in the county track meet here, and captured both the high school and Junior high championship.

The Yellow Jacket harriers were runnersup in both divisions, being squeezed out by two points in the senior event and being overwhelmed 66½-23½ in the junior meet.

Team scores in the high school affair were Pierceton, 61 14/15;

Syracuse, 60; Etna Green 36 1/30; Leesburg 15; Sidney 13; Atwood 9 3/5; Mentone 8; Claypool 7; North Webster 5 3/5; Beaver Dam 3 1/3; and Silver Lake, 2.

Denton of Syracuse paced the field in both the 100 and 440-yard dashes. Other local winners were Folger, third in shop put; Alfrey and Disher, second and third in broad jump; Druckamiller, fifth in high hurdles; Davis, second in 100-yard dash; Rinker,

first in the mile run; Williamson and Guy, third and fourth in low hurdles; Gottschalk, fourth in 880-yard run; Davis, first in 220-yard dash; and a team of Denton, Davis, Jones, and Williams from here won the 880-yard relay.

Syracuse freshmen have a meet scheduled at Pierceton 10 May and the Junior High Land of Lakes Track meet is scheduled the day following at Warsaw.
