Boat Registration Good For Three Years

Indiana conservation officers are busy filling requests for boat registrations.

A boats powered by an engine of more than six horsepower must be registered, according to the Indiana law. Size and length have no bearing on the law.

Boat owners using Indiana lakes from more than 90 days should apply for Indiana registration.

The registration is good for three years unless the boat is sold.

Applications can be obtained from boat sale agencies, some sporting goods stores and the county clerk's office. The license fee is \$3.

Mrs. James Kirkwood assisted in serving refreshments.

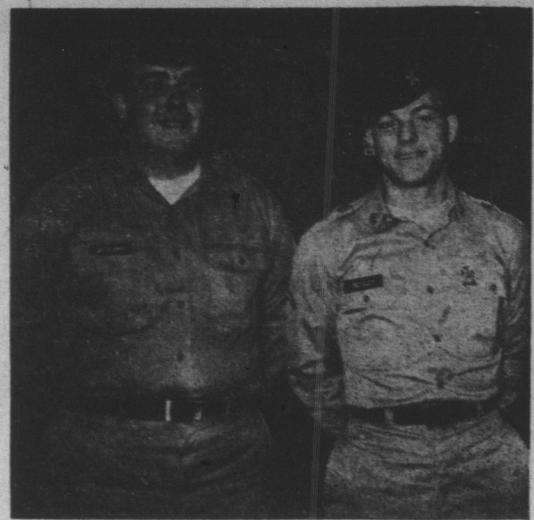
The next meeting will be July 7, at 7:30 p.m. at the home of Mrs. W. E. Long. The program will include a tour of the Long garden.
