Out On Bond Auer Now Held By Elkhart County

Tom Auer, 18, of Syracuse was released from Kosciusko county jail June 16 on \$1,000 bond after being charged with forgery and uttering a forged check. He is now being held in the Elkhart county jail on \$3,000 bond.

Auer admitted that he passed \$400 in checks in Kosciusko county and \$166 in Elkhart county during the past month. He used the names of several Kosciusko county residents in passing the checks.

Sgt. Don Snyder of the Warsaw Police caught Auer June 15 after he attempted to pass a check at a Warsaw supermarket.

Three guns were found in his car at the time of his arrest.

Relatives told officers that Auer had received treatment for leukemia in a southern hospital. Auer later told Sheriff Sam Holbrook that this was a false report.


