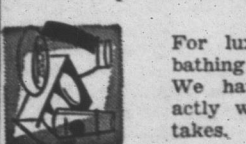

HOLIDAY CUPCAKES FROM SWEET CHOCOLATE CAKE RECIPE



Christmas cupcakes, a variation of the famous Sweet Chocolate Cake recipe, are amusingly decorated and richly delicious.

SWEET CHOCOLATE CUPCAKES

1 package Baker's German's Sweet Chocolate

1/2 cup boiling water

1/2 cup shortening

1 1/2 cups sugar

4 egg yolks, unbeaten

1 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon vanilla

1 teaspoon soda

1 cup buttermilk

2 1/2 cups sifted all-purpose flour

4 egg whites

Melt chocolate in 1/2 cup of boiling water. Cool. Mean-

while, cream shortening and sugar until light and fluffy. Add

egg yolks, salt, vanilla, and melted chocolate. Beat until

well blended. Dissolve soda in buttermilk. Add sifted flour al-

ternately with buttermilk to

egg mixture, beating after each addition until batter is smooth. Beat egg whites until stiff peaks will form. Fold into batter.

Line muffin tins with cupcake liners. Spoon batter into liners, filling about two-thirds full. Bake in a moderate oven (350° F.) for about 25 minutes, or until cake springs back when lightly pressed. Cool. Makes about 3 dozen cupcakes.

To Frost: Insert fork in bottom of cupcake and swirl Seven Minute frosting over top and sides. Decorate with flaked coconut, tinted flaked coconut, silver dragees, candy sprinkles, cinnamon candies, and small gumdrops.
